St. Mark's Episcopal church operates a unified Scouting Program via two Troops serving youth between the ages of 11 and 17 - Troop 211 (Boys) and Troop 1211 (Girls). Each troop is led by its own Scoutmaster, who work together with elected youth leaders from both Troops to deliver a single Scouting program. The Troops meet and participate in activities together and share resources (adult leadership, finances, camping equipment etc.).

On overnight campouts, boys and girls camp at the same campground and participate in activities together, while camping in separate campsites.

Troop Activities Include:



Weekly Meetings: focus on skills instruction and games which are related to a monthly activity theme (climbing, first aid, canoeing, marksmanship, etc.)



Monthly Campouts: provide an opportunity for Scouts to put the skills they learn at weekly meetings into practice and are based on the same theme as the preceding weekly meetings.



Annual Summer Camp: week-long residential summer camp is a capstone experience for the year; Troops 1/211 attend camps in mild climates (mountains or coast); Scouts earn merit badges, participate in fun activities and build team cohesion throughout the week.



High Adventure Treks: Scouts ages 14+ have the opportunity to participate in various "high adventure" opportunities (backpacking, sailing, etc.).



Community Service: Opportunities to perform meaningful service include monthly gatherings to prepare lunches for the non-profit Kids' Meals, periodic scout-led "Eagle Projects", an annual Troop service project and more!
